

## The Rhone Varietals

This vast area includes Syrah, Grenache, Mourvèdre and Cinsault. The wines seldom have wood aging. Asian spice, tobacco, cherry, coffee, bacon, smoke and licorice often surprise us in these Rhone based varietals. These wines work wonderfully with the rich grilled and roasted meats on our menu and are grouped by appellation, and listed from medium to full-bodied.

### Cayuse

**Cayuse is named for a Native American tribe whose name was taken from the French word for rocks, *cailloux*. Winemaker Christophe Baron planted his vineyards amidst stony, rocky soil which resemble the greatest appellations of the Southern Rhone. The highly stressed vines result in concentrated fruit, that is true to each specific vineyard site. Cayuse is the first vineyard in Washington State to farm using biodynamic methods.**
